I recently heard questions in regard to the fire extinguisher requirements on boats. Let me try to set the record straight. I will cover only portable extinguishers on boats under 65 feet, not fixed extinguishers. This also only covers recreational boats.

33 CFR 175.380 Sub a : vessels built model years 1953-2017, the fire extinguishers need not be replaced but must be in good and serviceable condition. If any are replaced, they must be dated as in Sub b below.

33CFR 175.380 Sub b: all extinguishers installed after 22 Aug 2016 must meet the requirements in 33 CFR 175.305-320. This covers what is required on boats as to size of boat and the amount of extinguishers needed. They must be date stamped on the bottom and expire 12 years from date of stamp, and be in good and serviceable condition. Boats model year 2018 and up are required to have all portable extinguishers dated as above.

I hope this information clears up extinguisher requirements on your boats.

Be sure your extinguishers meet the above requirements and wear your PFD!




